Conditional Use 1/2001 E.Schroeder SE 9-5-JW Moved by Sieg Neumann, Seconded by Leo Kornelsen:

#41/01. Whereas Mr. Eldon Schroeder has made application for conditional use to construct and operate a 5,000 isowean nursery hog operation in the SE 1/4 of Section 9-5-1 WPM;

And Whereas a public hearing was held on February 14, 2001;

Therefore Be It Resolved that the Rural Municipality of Morris hereby approves this conditional Use No. 1/2001 subject to the following conditions:

1. That the lagoon have a minimum 400 day storage capacity at ground level and that barley straw cover, or better alternative at Council's approval, as odour control, be maintained on the lagoon with the barley straw cover installation being done by June 1st each year with the lagoon walls elevated to be at least 2 feet above ground level or above the 1997 flood level which ever is highest.

- That the Morris Livestock Guidelines be adhered to.
- 3. That all additional driveways and accesses shall be at the expense of the owner.
- 4. That there be a cold storage unit of sufficient size for dead animals or that the operation is to have a container unit with 48 hour dead animal pickup.
- 5. That a minimum three row tree shelterbelt of a minimum of 2 varieties, be planted and maintained around the site with the trees being planted for the first spring with 1 row of trees being at least 4 feet high.
- 6. That a 1% refundable performance bond of capital construction costs be submitted to the Municipality.
- That the manure disposal be done by direct injection. 7.
- That the lagoon be a minimum of 500 feet from the property lines and 8. that the barns be located at least at a 250 foot setback from the gravel road.
- 9. That the barn vents be updraft ventilation.

Rosenort Speed Zones

- 1. That an 80 km/hr. speed zone be designated at approximately the ½ mile line on the North of Section 6-5-1 EPM for traffic travelling East on P.R. 205.
- 2. That a 50 km/hr. speed limit be designated at a point approximately 100 feet east of the new bridge on the North of Section 6-5-1 EPM.
- 3. That for traffic travelling West in to Rosenort, a 50 km/hr speed zone be designated East of Canola Drive.
- 4. That for traffic travelling West into Rosenort an 80 km/hr speed zone be designated at a point approximately 400 feet east of the 50 km/hr. sign.
