He was informed that some of the complaints received were regular caretaking duties and should not have to be discussed with him to get them done. The municipality had drawn up duties for the caretaker and it was felt that now was a proper time to advertise the position and have it available to everyone, including Mr. and Mrs. Marion.

Delegation

Mr. Harold Dyck and Mr. Abe Sawatsky, representing the Lowe Farm Community Hall Committee, gave Council a presentation regarding the situation concerning a community hall for Lowe Farm. The community had decided that due to a grant for a new building not being available, they would not continue to proceed with a new building. They had therefore decided that their best alternative would be to purchase the former school in Lowe Farm. They therefore are requesting that the municipality commence proceedings to have the property purchased and placed in the municipalities name. They had recontacted many of the money pledges for the new community hall and expected to retain about \$12,000.00 in pledge funds which would be used to upgrade the facility and it was not forecasted that there would be a levy required for the building. There is also the possiblity that the New Horizons Club would be in the north end of the building.

Delegation

Mr. Jay McCulloch met with Council to discuss the forcasts of a 1986 grasshopper situation. He indicated that 1986 would generally be the same as that of 1985. This will depend on the spring weather conditions. He then explained that for 1986 the regulations would be required to be followed. An application must be submitted prior to spraying, public notices published, etc. The spraying must be done by a licenced pesticide applicator, however, the exception to this is that the farmer may still spray the road allowances his property. If the farmer is paid by the municipality, then the municipality is eligible for the provincial rebate, and if the farmer is not paid then the municipality is not eligible for the rebate.
