THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris a Special Meeting at 9:00 A.M. on Friday, September 22, 1989 in the Council Chambers of the R. M. of Morris.

Reeve Dan Thiessen presided. Present were Councillors: George St. Hilaire, Bill Martens, Allan Dickson, Glenn Curdt, Harold Dyck.

The purpose of this special meeting was to continue with the remainder of the agenda and items from the September 14, 1989 regular meeting.

Regional Library

Moved by Glenn Curdt, Seconded by Allan Dickson: #253/89. Whereas meeting of interested ratepayers of the Rural Municipality of Morris and the Town of Morris has been held, at which interest in the creation of a Regional Library was expressed;

And Whereas as a result of the interest expressed, a Committee has been created to organize the feasibility of the establishment of a Regional Library to serve areas of the Red River Valley; Now Therefore Be It Resolved that:

- a) the Rural Municipality of Morris approves of the establishment of a committee to explore the feasibility and desireability of creating a Regional Library;b) the Rural Municipality of Morris authorize the said Committee
- b) the Rural Municipality of Morris authorize the said Committee to solicit and accept donations from community organizations and individuals for the purposes of undertaking said feasibility studies for the creation of the said Regional Library.

Sperling School

Moved by Glenn Curdt, Seconded by W. E. Martens: #254/89. Whereas the Sperling Community Club wish to have use of the property formerly occupied by the Sperling School; And Whereas the Midland School Division will consent to the transfer of this property to the Rural Municipality of Morris; And Whereas the Sperling Community Club will reimburse the Municipality for the cost of legal fees, etc. required for the acquisition of this property;

And whereas the Sperling Community Club understands that the maintenance and operation of the structure and grounds must be done with the funds of the Sperling Community Club; Therefore Be It Resolved that the Rural Municipality of Morris proceed to negotiate with Midland School Division to obtain title to this property being described as the South 347 feet of the North 673 feet of the West 627.7 feet South of Henry Street and East of Main Street stated under title no. D126492.

Rosenort Grant-in-Aid Moved by W. E. Martens, Seconded by Allan Dickson: #269/89. Whereas the Rural Municipality of Morris has an approved grant-in-aid works project for a road upgrading in the U.V.D. of Rosenort for 1989;

And Whereas the proposed work to be done under this grant-in-aid project has been changed slightly;

Therefore Be It Resolved that the road upgrading project is to be amended slightly with the description of the work to be done being described as follows:

Lower the dyke to the level of P.R. 205 from P.R. 205 southward for 200 feet, then rise at a 3% grade back to the top of the dyke level as set out in the upgrading dyke drawings from Water Resources. Also cut the rest of the road portion dyke approximately nine inches from the required level indicated on drawings to accommodate three to four inches of preporation fill to be placed this fall and six inches of concrete to be placed in the summer of 1990, with the finished top of the road to be the current height of the dyke as per Water Resources drawings.
