The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris held its regular meeting at 10:00 A.M. on Thursday, December 13, 1990 in the Council Chambers of the R. M. of Morris.

Minutes

Moved by George St. Hilaire, Seconded by Harold Dyck: #340/90. Resolved that the minutes of the November 8, 1990 regular meeting and the November 27, 1990 Board of Revision and Special Meeting be now adopted as presented.

Hiebert Land Purchase Moved by W. E. Martens, Seconded by D. Zacharias: #341/90. Whereas the Rural Municipality of Morris has purchased land from Mr. Weldon Hiebert and Council wishes to make adjustments to the arrangements previously set;
Therefore Be It Resolved that Mr. Hiebert not be charged his share

Therefore Be It Resolved that Mr. Hiebert not be charged his share of legal and survey costs and that the land rental for 1990 not be charged;

And Further Be It Resolved that this must also be agreed to by the Town of Morris.

Whereas the Municipal Assessment Branch has presented Council with a further listing of possible assessment changes to certain properties in the R. M. of Morris; Therefore Be It Resolved that Council accepts these recommended changes and authorizes that tax adjustments be done for the 1990 year.

Delegation

Ms. Joan Masters appeared before Council with regards to her letter to Council concerning the road allowance which passes in front of her property to the Red River. Apparently, people are using this road allowance to travel to the Red River for purposes of fishing, snowmobiling, etc. and as a result have caused a concern to Ms. Masters.

Ms. Masters was informed that this was indeed a road allowance and could be used by people wishing to travel on the land. No one had the right to block or stop traffic along this road allowance as long as it is classified as a road allowance.

Ms. Masters was concerned about traspassing on her property and the aspect of bonfires along the river area. She was told to fence her property to keep people from trespassing onto her

Variation Board property.

Moved by Glenn Curdt, Seconded by Allan Dickson: #347/90. Resolved that the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris now resolves into the Variation Board of the R. M. of Morris to consider application no 11/90.

Ritchot.

The floor was then opened to presentation at 1:50 P.M. concerning the public hearing for conditional use application no. 3/90. Present were Mr. Lorne Siemens and Mr. Mark Milne who spoke to Council in favor of the Conditional Use Application. Council and delegation discussed some aspects of the actual operation, the lagoon set up, spreading of the waste, smell produced, etc. There are no households within one mile to the site location and the lagoon is sized to hold a two years supply of waste at the number of hogs applied for. When the lagoon is emptied, it would likely take less than one day and at this time, the smell would be very strong but likely no more so than other hog operations.

Cond. Use L. Siemens 18-5-1E Moved by Allan Dickson, Seconded by W. E.Martens: #350/90. Whereas Mr. Lorne Siemens has applied for a conditional use permit to allow for the operation of a 1000 head of hog livestock feedlot operation in the West half of the SW½ of Section 18, in Township 5 and Range 1 E.P.M.;

And Whereas this property is in an "A40" Rural District zoning; And Whereas the public hearing for this conditional use application was held on December 13, 1990:

was held on December 13, 1990; Therefore Be It Resolved that the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris hereby approves this application for conditional use order no. 3/90.
