

MAY 18 1928

A meeting of the Council was held on the above date present the Reeve and Councillors Irvine, Carl Jenkins, Albert Heppner and Ribordy the minutes of last regular meeting held April 20th and Special meeting held April 30th were read and declared adopted as read.

A great many delegations were present. Mr Warner asked for deepening of ditch on Merriman line Councillor Irvine agreed to look after same.

A. Anderson & R. Dickson asked for a bridge. At 15-5-10 the Reeve informed them that arrangements were made to look after same. L.W. Sumner and several others asked for grade West of Lr 27-5-16 the matter was laid over until next meeting.

Several delegations from Ward 4 appeared before the Council asking for grades and ditches. The matter would be attended to later. Mr Varnette interviewed Council regarding the cleaning out of ditch on road one mile south of Anderson's. Councillor Irvine was instructed to investigate the matter.

A delegation of the business men of Low Farm interviewed the Council regarding having cement sidewalks constructed in front of two blocks in the village of Low Farm. They were asked to submit a petition signed by the property holders stating they were willing to pay their proportion of cost and have same presented at next meeting.

By Law 444 By Law 444 was read a first time regarding Flowing Bank D.W. and as considerable opposition was presented it was ordered filed, for the present.

R. Lewis interviewed Council regarding culverts on road allmann south of River Lot 370 the Public Works Committee were instructed to inspect same and report at next meeting.

That tenders be called for grading in the Rural Municipality of Morris. Tenders to be for both labor and blade grade work at a price per yard on new work and by the hour for old work. The party whose tender was accepted to put up a bond for 500⁰⁰ as security that the work would be done satisfactory. Tenders to be in by Saturday noon May 26th 1928.

A petition was received from the business men and others of Sperling asking that the Council pass a By-law declaring Thursday afternoon a holiday in the Village of Sperling commencing Thursday May 31 and ending July 26th 1928

That the petition of the business people of Sperling be received and the clerk be herewith instructed to have the necessary by law prepared for meeting to be held May 26th 1928
