That the appeal of Mr. Marcoux be granted and that his assessment on Stock be reduced from 750<sup>00</sup> to 500<sup>00</sup> (Carried)

Moved by Councillor Braun seconded " Stevenson

That the Lurin City Machinery Bldg <sup>Shump.</sup> be assessed Land 10<sup>00</sup> Building 2000<sup>00</sup> personal Property 1000<sup>00</sup> for the year 1931 Carried.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson seconded " Chubb.

That there being no further appeals against the Assessment we now declare the court of Revision closed and that the Council meet in a regular meeting Carried

D. Kenny purchased said lot and got title in own name.  
moved by Councillor Chubb  
seconded " Ribordy

That the offer of D. Kenny to pay  
300<sup>00</sup> as full payment in lieu of arrears of taxes on lot 426  
be accepted providing D. Kenny receives title to property  
in own name. (Carried)

The matter of furnishing seed grain under the Dominion  
Government proposition was discussed and the Council decided  
that the Municipality was not in a position to take advantage  
of the offer.

An application for old age pension was received from Robt  
Turner

moved by Councillor Snare  
seconded " Stevenson

That this Council recommend  
the appropriation of Robt Turner for old age pension.  
(Carried)

moved by Councillor Ribordy  
seconded " Gilbert

That the Secretary Treasurer be instruct  
ed to have 100 bills of the amendment to the Land Drainage  
Act printed (No 82) (Carried)

Communication was received from Man. Telephone System  
re rent of Lot 9. Behr. Explaining advising that the rent  
asked for was too high. The Council agreed that no  
reduction would be made.

a communication was received from Western Trust Co  
re road allowance Lot 367-368. The Council instructed  
the Clerk to advise the Co that the matter would be  
looked into as soon as the conditions permitted.

The question of adding 10% penalty to taxes was discussed  
moved by Councillor Brown  
seconded " Gilbert

That the Penalty of 10% be added  
to taxes on the first day of April 1921.  
(Carried)

Bills of accounts were handed to the Finance Committee the  
Finance committee reported the Treasurer as being authorized

March 4<sup>th</sup> 1931

to pay the accounts as per list.  
 moved by Comptroller Robert  
 Seaman & seconded

That the report of the Finance Committee  
 be accepted and the Board and the Comptroller be authorized to  
 issue cheques for the several amounts.  
 (Carried)
