

18 SEP 1931

A regular meeting of the Council was held on the above date present the Reeve and Councillors Clubb, Quarr, Stevenson, Hebert, Braun and Reboay.

The minutes of former meeting was read and declared adopted as read.

A Letter was read from Department of Mines and Natural Resources in answer to enquiry re timber limit for wood re Relief. Further information would be forthcoming by Sept. 20.

A reply was received from Department re resolutions for woods regarding closed season for prairie chicken advising Council that the Department had decided to make no change in the regulations.

A communication was received from Superintendent Kingdon of the Can Pac Railway stating that the fence had been removed at crossing one mile south of Mt. Leduc.

Dr. McSavin submitted a letter advising the Council of fees he was willing to accept indigent persons for during the winter in the Luce-Jour District.

The Clerk was instructed to advise him that the fees were satisfactory but it would be necessary to communicate with the Councillor Mr. Braun to decide which would be classed as indigent. Mr. Kueffner asked for a grade east of Sec. 2-5-14 and the matter was left with Councillor Quarr.

It was decided to trim up the edges of the Luce-Jour Lane road with a grader also to have the brush and dirt cleaned out of the ditches where necessary.

Armed Walter asked for a ditch in Ward one he stated he was willing to do the work himself the matter was left with Councillor Clubb.

Two applications for old age pensions were received one from Mrs. Mary Leatis and the other from W. H. Taylor of Union Point as Mr. Taylor application had been recommended before the application was held up for further information. It was moved by Councillor Quarr seconded " Stevenson

That the application of Mrs. Mary Leatis for old age pension be recommended by this Council

notice was received from Secretary of Union of Montrose Municipalities stating that the Convention would be held in Winnipeg December 1, 2, and 3.

That L. D. Collette of Lots 497-499 be appointed pound keeper for years 1931 and 1932. Ward 3. (Carried)

Mr Braun nominus weed inspector spoke to the council in regard to the work he had done and stated that there was considerable roads to clean up yet also certain pieces of land to be seeded down along ditch dumps and on account of this asked that he be kept on for another month.

That Mr Braun be hired for another month to act as weed inspector, at a salary of \$100⁰⁰ per month.

The matter of Relief work was discussed and it was decided that work would be done where necessary in each of ward and that registration of unemployed would take place in Morris, Lucas-Jann and Spring.

That the Councillors in each ward be appointed to look after the relief work done in his own ward

The holding of Tax sales was discussed and it was decided to have a sale about the end of October.

The Clerk was instructed where at least ~~at~~ fifty percent of the 1929 taxes were paid to not to sell the property.

Bills and accounts were handed the Finance Committee the Finance Committee reported the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the accounts as per list.

That the report of the Finance Committee be accepted and the Reas and Clerk be authorized to issue cheques for the several accounts.
