

A regular meeting of the Council was held on the above date present the Reeve and Councillors Leubb, Smarr, Stevenson, Herbert and Thieson. The minutes of former meeting were read and declared adopted as read.

A communication was read from the Municipal Commissioner re finances for the year.

The matter of arranging a budget for the year 1932 was discussed and the following resolution was passed moved by Councillor Thieson

That the expenditures in each of the wards for public works during the year 1932 is not to exceed the sum of One Thousand Dollars. (Carried)

That the tender of Romero Bartlett for scraping and painting Silver Plains Ferry be accepted and that the tender of painter R. J. Coatis for scraping and painting Union Point Ferry be accepted. (Carried)

moved by Councillor Leubb

seconded . Smarr

That Councillor Stevenson be appointed as inspector over the work of painting ferries. (Carried)

moved by Councillor Herbert

seconded . Thieson

That the Assessment Roll of 1931 be adopted as the assessment Roll for the year 1932 and that the Assessor J. H. Bestwick be instructed to make the necessary changes in the Roll and that the Council meet as a Court of Revision on March 2. (Carried)

A petition was received from residents of Lower Arm asking for fuel, seed and fuel. Messrs Brown of Lower Arm also spoke of the matter. The Reeve stated that the Municipality was not in a position to grant the request. But if they wished to interview the Government regarding the matter he would ~~give them~~ ^{assist} ~~what~~ ^{as} ~~well~~ ^{well} ~~them~~ ^{them} as a delegate.
