He was of the opinion that the case against the Municipality would be dropped and did not think it advisable to proceed against the Plaintiffs for the costs. The Council concurred in this.

A letter was read from Department of Education warning Councils not to pass by Laws changing School Districts where Deputations were pending without first getting consent of Department.
