

A regular meeting of the Council was held on the above date present the Reeve and all the Councillors.

The minutes of former meeting were read and declared adopted as read. Communications were read from Relief Department of Public works re relief for Jacob Pankratz; the above party being in Melsman Municipality and would be returned to Morris Municipality unless the sum of 15<sup>00</sup> per mos was guaranteed towards the keep of the family.

The Council decided it would be better to pay this amount than have the family returned.

Information was received from the Department in regard to Relief

a letter was received from the Tax Commission advising the Council that the Assessment Roll had been ~~accepted~~ accepted as the Assessment Roll for the year 1933 and the following resolution was passed  
 moved by Councillor Smar  
 seconded " Clubb.

Resolved that with the sanction and approval of Tax Commission, the Assessment for the year 1930 made and completed pursuant to the provisions of the Assessment Act and finally revised as the Assessment Roll for the Municipality on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of March A.D. 1930 be adopted as the Assessment Roll on which the rate of taxation for the year 1933 be fixed and levied subject to a revision of said Assessment in the manner provided in the Assessment Act. "Carried"

The question of adding penalty to taxes on Dec 16<sup>th</sup> was discussed and the following resolution passed  
 moved by Councillor Ribordy  
 seconded " Ribordy

That the time for adding penalty on taxes be extended one month.

Applications for old age pension were received from Johann Penner of Lone Farm and James McDonald of Springman  
 moved by Councillor Steiner  
 seconded " Ribordy

That this Council recommend the application of Johan Penner and James McDonald for old age pension. "Carried"

The usual grant to the Social Service for Christmas boxes was discussed and the following resolution passed.  
 moved by Councillor Clubb  
 seconded " Steiner

That a grant of 30<sup>00</sup> be given to the Social Service.

 now considered as read the second and third time and passed and  
 the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to sign and seal the same.

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee the  
 Finance Committee reported that the Treasurer is hereby authorized  
 to pay the accounts as per list.

Moved by Councillor Thierin

That the report of the Finance Committee  
 be accepted and the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to issue  
 cheques for the several amounts. (Carried)

Mr. Bistons interviewed Council in regard to the condition of the  
 families asking for relief he stated that he had visited 40 families  
 and had several more applications to attend to. Reports were submitted  
 on families visited.

The finances of the Municipality were discussed with the Manager  
 of the local bank and the outlook for the coming year was  
 gone into. The Reeve was instructed to take the matter up later  
 with the bank and arrange for a line a credit similar to that of 1932.

The Reeve Stoney was asked to vacate the chair and Councillor  
 Rebordy took the chair he advised the Council that it was  
 customary at this meeting to make a grant to the Reeve in  
 consideration of the work done by him during the past year

Moved by Councillor Stevenson  
 seconded " Hebut

That a grant of 150<sup>00</sup> be given to Reeve Stoney  
 for the year 1932.

Reeve Stoney was then called to the chair and presented with the  
 cheque and in a few well chosen remarks he thanked the Council  
 for their cooperation during the past year and expressed  
 upon them the continued delinquency in regard to financial  
 matters that it would be necessary during 1933.

The meeting then adjourned.
