

A regular meeting of the Council was held on the above date present the Reeve and councillors Leubb, Ruess, Stevenson, Ruess, Thies and Ruess minutes of former meeting of February 16th and special meeting of March 3. 2d were read and declared adopted as usual Mrs. Bham of Loewen spoke to the Council in connection with the purchase of the Rev. 31-5-100. on crop payments.

The Reeve ~~stated~~ stated the Council would discuss the matter and advise him of the decision after a discussion the following motion was passed moved by councillor Ruess seconded - Leubb.

That the Municipality put a price of 5⁰⁰ per acre on all land owned by the Municipality and that in the event of a sale a cash payment of at least 100⁰⁰ per quarter be required. (Carried)

By Law 529. By Law no 529 was read a first time moved by councillor Ruess seconded - Ruess.

That by law no 529 being a by law for the purpose of raising a levy on the assessment of the Rural Municipality of Morris for the year 1934, having been read the first time be now considered as read the second and third time and passed and the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to sign and seal the same. (Carried)

A letter was read from Mr. Laird who is representing the Morris Bridge Area stating that he was introducing a bill in the Legislature to have the Council return the Bridge Area of one half of the special levy for the next eight years and that this portion be spread over the whole of the Municipality, less the sum contributed by the Town of Morris.

After a discussion of the question the following resolution was passed moved by councillor Stevenson seconded - Leubb.

That the Reeve C. L. Stony be appointed to meet the Committee in the Legislature dealing with the Morris Bridge Area, and that Reeve Stony be instructed to oppose the bill. (Carried)

The question of discontinuing relief was brought up and the following resolution passed moved by councillor Ruess seconded by - Ruess

That the Municipality cease to give

relief after the first of May 1934. (Carried)
 A circular was read from the Extension Branch of the Department
 of Agriculture in connection with the Grasshopper situation.
 It was decided to make the necessary arrangements
 in regard to securing stations.

A copy of the financial statement of the Sperbury Community Bank
 was read to the Council it showed the last receipts for the season
 amounting to \$371.²⁴ amounts owing \$162.⁴⁶ Expenditures \$370.⁵⁴ and
 accounts owing \$362.⁴⁴ leaving a deficit for the season of \$199.⁷⁸
 The report was ordered filed.

A letter was received from A. R. Brown of Sperbury accepting
 the position of Trustee of the Sperbury Community Bank to which he
 had been appointed.

A letter was received from M. D. Wiebe asking that he be
 started farming under the bank to the land scheme
 the Council could not see their way clear to grant his request.

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee
 the Finance Committee reported the Treasurer is hereby authorized
 to pay the accounts as per list.

moved by Councillor Thierin
 seconded " Name

That the report of the Finance Committee
 be accepted and the Treas. and Clerk issue cheques for the
 several amounts. (Carried)

Jacob Reinen sent in a request for seed as he had leg bushes
 of wheat on hand being the Municipality share of last years crop
 he was allowed to use this.

Several applications for relief were considered and
 recommended for different amounts.

The meeting then adjourned.
