A petition from the residents of Silver Plains and Aubigny district was presented to the Council asking for a mailing station to be established at Belovs-Plains after a discussion it was decided to have ~~poison~~ grasshopper delivered at this point as the following resolution does

That a distributing station be established at Silver Plains for distributing poison for the convenience of the farmers of that district. (Carried)

David Herbert of Aubigny spoke to the Council he stated that he was unable to pay his rent and consequently he would be compelled to vacate his house, he asked the Council for assistance.

That this Council recommend the paying of the rent to Paul Bertellette for six months in advance dated from May 15th for D. Herbert amount \$3⁰⁰ per month. (Carried)

Messrs J. D. and J. Weiss of Lowe-Jarvis spoke to the Council in connection with graveling etc of the road from Jordan siding to Morris. They stated that a petition was being presented to the Government asking that this road be made a provincial highway and that the cost of the work be borne by the Government under the unemployment relief scheme. The delegation asked that the Council endorse the scheme.

That this Council recommend the project of the petitioners from Lowe-Jarvis and Roland to have the Government complete the highway joining Nos 3 and 14 and that this work be done under the Government relief plan. (Carried)

By Law 530

By Law No 530 was read a first time

That By Law No 530 being a by-law for the purpose of not remitting penalties when consolidating areas of lots. Having been read the first time be now considered as having been read the second and third time and passed and the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to sign and seal the same. (Carried)

A letter was read from the Manitoba Power Commission enclosing copy of new agreement for 1934 in connection with the Spurling Street Lighting asking that same be completed by the Council after a discussion the following resolution was passed.

That the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to sign and seal the agreement with the Manitoba Power Commission in connection with the Street Lighting of Spurling (Carried)

The question of removing drift soil from the Grade ditches was discussed and it was decided to have same done by local firms as Ward 5 apparently had more of this work than the other wards it was decided to appoint a foreman to look after the work.

That B. W. Thurin be appointed to act as foreman on the work of cleaning out ditches in Ward 5. 'Carried'
 Communication was received from Department of Health in answer to letter regarding School Sanitary They stated that they were unable to give any financial support to the project but would furnish a nurse free of charge.
 The Council of Public Works acknowledged receipt of resolution in connection with Drainage Lewis.

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee the Finance Committee reported the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the accounts as per list

That the report of the Finance Committee be accepted and the Receiver and Clerk be authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts
