

Morris February 21st. 1936.

That by-law No. 567 being a by-law for the purpose of levying rates for the year 1936, having been read a first time be now considered as having been read the second and third time and passed, and that the Reeve and ~~Secretary~~ Clerk be authorized to sign and seal the same.
