

September 18th, 1936.

The Council met as a Court of Revision on the above date at 10 A.M. Communications were received from R. W. Moody, J. H. Kastner and A. A. Cox asking that on account of waste land their Assessment be reduced. After a discussion the following resolution was passed.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,
Seconded by Councillor Thiesen,

That the Assessment on the property of W. R. Moody, J. H. Kastner, and A. A. Cox be left the same as at present. (Carried)
The Assessment of Lumber Yard and house at McTavish was appealed against by L. H. Audet, after consideration the following resolution was passed.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,
Seconded by Councillor Snarr,

That the Assessment on the Lumber shed and Cottage situated on the East half of Section 10-6-1E be reduced from \$2,000.00 to \$1,200.00 (carried)

Mrs. Hoffman of De Wet appealed against the assessment on her property, after considering same the following resolution was passed.

Seconded by Councillor Gehring,

That the assessment on the buildings on part of the North West quarter of Section 1-4-1W be reduced from \$500.00 to \$300.00. (Carried)

Other appeals were taken up and the following resolutions passed.

Seconded by Councillor Thiesen,

That the Assessment on Lot 18 Aubigny building be reduced from \$500.00 to \$400.00 and \$100.00 be added to personal stock. The Assessment on Mrs. Octavio Roy's House Lot 14-15 be reduced from \$960.00 to \$750.00. (Carried)

Moved by Councillor Snarr,
Seconded by Councillor Stevenson,

That the Assessment on the Imperial Oil Co. at Silver Plains be taken from the list as buildings have been moved away.

Moved by Councillor Thiesen (Carried)
Seconded by Councillor Gehring,

That the property of A. Kehler Lot 3 Block 3 Lowe Farm be reduced from \$575.00 to \$500.00. (Carried)

Moved by Councillor Clubb,
Seconded by Councillor Snarr,

That the Assessment on the following properties be added to the Assessment Roll for 1937.

SE 8-6-1W N. Brandt, House \$100.00 Warehouse \$600.00 Land \$50.00
SE 20-5-1E A. D. Loewen, Garage \$500.00
Dwelling House P. T. Krocker, \$1,000.00

Moved by Councillor Gehring,
Seconded by Councillor Clubb,

That the Court of Revision be closed and that the Assessor be instructed to make the necessary changes.

There being no further appeals the Court of Revision adjourned to meet in regular session at 1 P.M.

The Council reassembled at regular session at 1 P.M. The minutes of former meeting were read and declared adopted as read.

Mr. H. H. Friesen spoke to the Council in connection with the purchase of SW 29-5-1W, he offered \$500.00 cash and the balance of \$200.00 on crop payments, the Council declined the offer.

Messrs Hokenson & Lindquist interviewed the Council in connection with a grade near Sections 34 and 35-6-1E, Councillor Stevenson was instructed to look after it.

Mr. P. M. Friesen interviewed the Council in connection with N 1/2 36-5-2W, the Council advised him that if same was redeemed they would have no further interest in same.

A delegation composed of Messrs. Slater & G. Stevenson interviewed the Council in connection with purchasing a suitable barn to be used by the general public to stable their horses when driving to town. Mr. Slater stated the Town had the question in mind for some time and would like to know what the Rural Municipality thought of the idea.

Moved by Councillor Gehring,
Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That a committee be appointed to meet the Morris Council to consider the prospect of purchasing a barn for the use of the Community, the Committee to be composed of Reeve Churchill and Councillors Clubb and Snarr. (carried.)

Messrs. F. Last & Son interviewed the Council in connection with the cancelling of the arrears of drainage taxes, they were advised that this would be impossible for the Council to do.

Several requests were received for grading and repairing of roads, Councillor Snarr was instructed to make arrangements in connection with the widening of the Trump road.

The Noxious weed Inspector was instructed to look after the mowing of the roads.

A delegation from Lowe Farm consisting of Messrs. Heppner, Reimer and Braun, interviewed the Council in connection with the appointment of a Constable for night duty at Lowe Farm. After a discussion the delegation was authorized to engage a Constable for a month, the cost of same to be charged to the Ward.

The Reeve and Councillors Stevenson & McDonald inspected the road east of the Red River Bridge and recommended the cutting of the brush on a portion of same.

Bills and Accounts were handed to the finance Committee, the finance Committee reported the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the accounts as per list.

The meeting then adjourned.
