

Morris, Manitoba.
September 17th, 1937.

The Council met as a Court of Revision on the above date at 10.30 A.M. Mr. T. K. Bestwick Assessor produced a list of properties to be added to the Assessment Roll. He also discussed some changes in the assessment of properties already on the Roll.

Moved by Councillor Snarr,
Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That the following parcels be added to the Assessment Roll for the year 1938.

and that there being no further appeals Court of Revision be closed and the Assessor be instructed to make the necessary changes. (Carried)

The meeting adjourned to meet at 1 P.M.

The Council reassembled at 1 P.M. with all the members present. The minutes of former meeting were read and declared adopted as read.

A delegation from Lowe Farm interviewed the Council in connection with the gravelling of the Lowe Farm Kane highway. The Reeve explained that he had accompanied a delegation to Winnipeg which had interviewed the Minister of Public Works in this connection and the Minister had offered that the Government would pay seventy five percent of the cost of the project if the Municipality would pay the balance. The matter was discussed by the members of the Council and the following resolution passed.

Moved by Councillor Clubb,
Seconded by Councillor Snarr,

That this Council accept the offer of the Government to gravel the sixteen miles of road from Morris to Kane. The cost of same to be divided as follows: The Government to pay 75% of cost, and the Municipality to pay 25% of cost. The Government to look after the work, to employ local labor, and not to let the work by contract. Carried.

The question of relief was discussed and the following resolution passed.

Moved by Councillor Gehring,
Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That whereas there has been a bountiful harvest this season throughout this Municipality, thereby furnishing employment at good wages for every able bodied man who was willing to work, and earn sufficient money to support himself and his dependents during the coming winter. Now therefore be it resolved that this Council will not authorize relief to any able bodied resident of the Municipality this coming winter who did not avail himself of the opportunity to become self supporting and that notice to this effect be given full publicity. Carried.

The Secretary laid a list of lands on the table liable to be sold for arrears of taxes.

Moved by Councillor McDonald,
Seconded by Councillor Stevenson,

That whereas the Secretary Treasurer has submitted a list of all lands within the Municipality so liable to be sold for arrears of taxes pursuant to the statutes, and whereas the Council desires that a sale of lands for taxes be held. Now therefore the Council directs the Reeve in his discretion to take all proper proceedings as required by statute to collect said taxes by sale at the earliest possible moment. And further if for any reason sufficient buyers are not present at sale to purchase the different parcels the Reeve is hereby authorized and instructed to purchase the said parcels in the name of the Rural Municipality of Morris. Carried.

Two offers were received for the purchase of the Spt 27-5-2W as follows.

Henry Poetkan \$1,600.00, cash \$300.00 balance in 5 yearly payments.

F. B. Gehring \$1,600.00, cash 700.00 balance in 3 yearly payments.

The offer of F. B. Gehring was accepted.

The Question of farmers plowing up road allowances was brought up and the following resolution passed.

Moved by Councillor Thiessen,
Seconded by Councillor Gehring,

That this Council prohibit the plowing of road allowances up to the ditches, and in future any clean out work caused by this practice, the cost of same will be charged to the land from which the dirt came. Carried.

The Health Officers report was received in connection with Anna and Emma Quimet also Henry K. Friesen, after a discussion the following resolution was passed.

Moved by Councillor Snarr,
Seconded by Councillor Clubb,

That this Council recommend \$10.00 per month allowance to Henry K. Friesen, Morris, Manitoba, and that no allowance be recommended in the case of Anna and Emma Quimet on account of the medical report. Carried.

Mr. T. K. Bestwick who has been collecting accounts in connection with Feed Grain and Hospital spoke to the Council in regard to same.

Moved by Councillor Thiessen,
Seconded by Councillor Stevenson,

That Mr. T. K. Bestwick be given authority to collect all Hospital bills and Feed Grain notes. Carried.

By Law No. 592 Was read a first time.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,
Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That By Law No. 592 being a by law for the purpose of authorizing the assignment of Tax Sale Certificate covering Sec. 36-6-1E having been read the first time be now considered as having been read the second and third time and passed and the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to sign and seal same. Carried.

An offer of \$100.00 for the Scott property was received from D. D. Funk
Moved by Councillor Gehring,
Seconded by Councillor Thiessen,

That this Council sell lot Block 4 of Sperling for \$100.00 to D. D. Funk, following terms \$25.00 cash, balance \$5.00 per month until paid. Carried.

Mr. P. F. Penner spoke to the Council in connection with the purchase of NE 1/4 Section 30-4-2W. He stated he would pay all the arrears of taxes and costs together with the 1937 taxes for the quarter. After a discussion the following resolution was passed.

Moved by Councillor Gehring,
Seconded by Councillor Thiessen,

That this Council sell the North East Quarter of Sec. 30-4-2W to P. F. Penner at the amount equal to all arrears of taxes and costs together with the 1937 taxes.

A delegation from Lowe Farm asked the Council to make a survey for a road north of Block One Lowe Farm. The Clerk was instructed to make arrangements for same.

Messrs. Penner & Siemens asked the Council to regrade the road between sections re and 33-4-2W. The Reeve explained that the ward had expended its allotment for this year.

Mr. Code spoke to the members of the Council in connection with the condition of the Agricultural Society, he stated that unless there was an organization meeting this fall the Association of the Society would be lost. The Councillors all agreed to interest their residents of their respective wards so that a meeting could be held this fall.

Bills and accounts were handed to the finance Committee, the finance Committee reported the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the accounts as per list.

Moved by Councillor McDonald,
Seconded by Councillor Thiessen,

That the report of the Finance Committee be accepted and the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts. Carried.

The meeting on motion then adjourned.
