

Morris, Manitoba,  
January 21st, 1938.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on the above date with all the members of the Council present.

The minutes of former meeting held January 4th were read and declared adopted as read.

Mr. Mousseau of Aubigny discussed the question of rent for a house owned by himself and occupied by E. Clement. Councillor McDonald was instructed to look after the subject.

A number of applications for relief were received and investigated by the Council.

A communication was received from P. H. Penner in connection with an account he had presented, the subject was laid over for further information.

A request for a grant from the Canadian National Institute for the Blind was received and after a discussion the following resolution was passed.

Moved by Councillor Snarr,  
Seconded by Councillor Clubb,

That a grant of \$100.00 be given to the Canadian National Institute for the blind by this Municipality. Carried.

A petition was received signed by a number of Aubigny residents asking that the Council assist in the purchase of a wheel chair for Francis Palud who is crippled, the Clerk was instructed to make enquiries in connection with same.

The question of repairing and painting the Union Point ferry was discussed and the following resolution passed.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,  
Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That the Clerk be instructed to call for tenders for painting the Union Point ferry and repairing the floor, material to be supplied by the Municipality. Carried.

The mill rate in connection with the 1938 levies were discussed and after a lengthy discussion the following resolution was passed.

Moved by Councillor Clubb,  
Seconded by Councillor Stevenson,

That the Public Works levy be set at 5 mills and Social Service levy at 2 mills on the dollar for the year 1938. Carried.

The question of grading roads was discussed and a number of the Council were of the opinion that it would be more economical for the Municipality to have its own grading outfit, the question was left in abeyance for the present.

Councillor Spalding introduced the subject of gravelling the streets and building sidewalks in the Village of Lowe Farm, the subject was left over for further information.

A report from Mr. F. Whitehead, Pound Keeper in connection with the sale of a horse impounded, was read and filed.

Bills and accounts were handed to the finance Committee, the Committee reported that the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the accounts as per list.

Moved by Councillor Griffiths,  
Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That the report of the Finance Committee be accepted and the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts. Carried.

On motion the meeting then adjourned.
