By Law No. 621 was read a first time. Moved by Councillor Griffiths, Seconded by Councillor Spalding,

That By Law No. 621 being a by law for the the purpose of authorizing the assignment of Tax Sale Certificate No. 119 dated December 14th, 1932 re SE 24-5-2W to Sommerfelder Waisenant, having been read the first time be now considered as having been read the second and third time and passed, and the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to sign and seal the same. Carried.

The question of the Municipality entering into an agreement with the Pond Diggers and the farmer's in connection with payments due from the Government was discussed and it was agreed that the Municipality receive the money from the Department and pay same over to the Contractors on advice from the Department. The following resolution authorizing the agreement.

resolution passed. Moved by Councillor Irvine, Moved by Councillor McDonald,
Seconded by Councillor McDonald,
That the Clerk order two rear rubber

tires for the Drag Bractor. Carried.

The question of changing the next Council meeting date from July 21st, to July 28th was discussed and the following resolution passed.

That the next regular meeting of this Council be held Friday July 28th, 1939 at 1 P.M. Carried.

Councillor Spalding brought up the question of having a culvert changed in the C. N. Railway near Lowe Farm, and the following resolution was passed.

That the Clerk authorize the Canadian National Railway to remove culvert on North side of roadway and install same on

East side, the estimated cost to be \$100.00, said work to be done about one mile East of Lowe Farm. Carried.

A communication was received from Mrs. Parker in connection with the grading of road allowance South of River Lots 493-495, Councillor Stevenson was

instructed to see about same.

A discussion took place in connection with bridges that needed rebuilding etc. A communication was received from Dufferin Agricultural Society requesting the Council to take part in celebration to be held at the

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee, the Finance Committee reported the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the adcounts as per list.

Moved by Councillor Griffiths,

Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That the report of the Finance

Committee be accepted and the Reeve and Clerk issue cheques for the amounts. Carried.

The meeting then adjourned at 6 P.M. to meet on July 28th, at 1 P.M.
