

Morris, Manitoba.
April 17, 1942.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on the above date with all the members present.

The minutes of the last meeting held March 20th were read and declared adopted as read.

The question of confirming the purchase of a Victory Bond was discussed and the following resolution passed:

Moved by Councillor Spalding,

Seconded by Councillor Griffiths,

That the purchase of the Five-Thousand Dollar Victory Bond by the Council be hereby confirmed. Carried.

A letter was read from the Canadian National Institute for the Blind asking for their usual grant.

Moved by Councillor McDonald,

Seconded by Councillor Stevenson,

That a grant of \$100.00 be made to the Canadian National Institute for the Blind. Carried.

Mr. G. Neufeldt interviewed the Council in connection with the purchase of the old road site on the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 8-6-1E, making an offer of \$25.00 for same.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,

Seconded by Councillor Davidson,

That the offer of G. Neufeldt of \$25.00 net to the Council for a parcel of land described in Plan 534 in the Winnipeg Land Titles Office, be accepted. Carried.

The purchase of pipe for culverts from the C.T. Lount Company was discussed and the following resolution passed:

Moved by Councillor Davidson,

Seconded by Councillor Snarr,

That the Secretary be instructed to order 300 feet of iron pipe from the C. T. Lount Company providing the pipe is satisfactory to the Council. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,

Seconded by Councillor Snarr,

That the Secretary be instructed to order a three-blade, nine-foot Drag with concave blade, to be shipped to McTavish. Carried.

A delegation composed of Messrs. Spaulding and Dickson interviewed the Council in regard to a grant to the Agricultural Society.

Moved by Councillor Spalding,

Seconded by Councillor Griffiths,

That this Council give a grant of \$250.00 to the Morris Agricultural Society. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,

Seconded by Councillor Griffiths,

That Councillor McDonald be instructed to have a boat built for use in connection with the Silver Plains Ferry. Carried.

A delegation composed of Messrs. McDonald, Blatto, etc., interviewed the Council in connection with a ditch to be constructed across River Lots 482 to 510 north of Aubigny. The Council stated that they would have an engineer look into the matter and if possible have the work completed.

A delegation composed of H. Anderson and J. Dickson interviewed the Council in regard to the water question north of Lowe Farm. The Reeve stated that certain recommendations had been made to the Drainage Board in connection with same.

A letter was received from the Bursar of St. John's College in connection with culverts adjoining Sections 20-6-2W and 21-6-2W. The complaint was turned over to Councillor Griffiths.

A communication was received from C. C. Peck asking \$50.00 damages for teams crossing his farm. The matter was left in abeyance for the present.

A letter was received from the Department of Health and Public Welfare in connection with the medical examination of all High School students. No action was taken at present in regard to the matter.

A communication was read from R. M. Fisher, Deputy Municipal Commissioner in connection with the conservation of expenditures by the Councils.

Bills and accounts werer handed to the Finance Committee, the Finance Committee reported that the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the accounts as per list.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,
Seconded by Councillor Snarr,

That the report of the Finance Committee be accepted and the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to issue cheques for the several accounts. Carried.

The meeting then adjourned to meet on Friday May 15th.
