

Morris, Manitoba.
October 15th, 1943.

The Council met as a Court of Revision on the above date with all members present.

Four appeals were received and dealt with by the Council as per Appeal Register.

A list of changes of ownership was laid on the table and recommended by the Council.

The following motion was then passed:

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,

Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That the Court of Revision be closed and that the Assessor be instructed to make the necessary changes as recommended by the Council and that the Council now meet in regular session. Carried.

The minutes of the last regular meeting held September 17th were read and declared adopted as read.

A representative of the Salvation Army interviewed the Council.

Moved by Councillor Griffiths,

Seconded by Councillor Davidson,

That this Council make a grant of \$200.00 to the Salvation Army, \$50.00 of which is to be used for the Red Shield Fund. Carried.

The Clerk submitted a price on culverts from C. T. Lount. After a discussion the following motion was passed:

Moved by Councillor McDonald,

Seconded by Councillor Spalding,

That this Council order from C. T. Lount & Company - two 36 ft. 36 in. culverts and two 30 ft. 36 in. culverts. Carried.

An application for Old Age Pension was received from Jean-Marie Ollivier of Aubigny.

Moved by Councillor McDonald,

Seconded by Councillor Spalding,

That the application of Jean-Marie Ollivier of Aubigny for Old Age Pension be approved by this Council. Carried.

The offer of the Department of Public Works in connection with the gravelling of Horse-Shoe Lake road was again taken up and the following resolution passed:

Moved by Councillor Anderson,

Seconded by Councillor Davidson,

That this Council accept the offer of gravelling cost of Morris Bridge to St. Mary's Highway as per terms offered by the Honorable Minister of Public Works. Carried.

Councillor Stevenson explained to the Council that some of the buildings on the right-of-way at Silver Plains caused a snow blockade on the road.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,

Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That this Council request the removal of tool-house and snow-fence at railroad crossing at Silver Plains as same cause the blocking of both roads in the winter time. Carried.

By-Law No. 672 was read a first time.

Moved by Councillor Stevenson,

Seconded by Councillor Davidson,

That By-Law No. 672 being a by-law for the purpose of transferring Lots 5 & 6 Block 10 in the village of Sperling to C. B. McNulty having been read the first time be now considered as having been read the second and third time and passed, and that the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to sign and seal same. Carried.

By-Law No. 673 was read a first time.

Moved by Councillor Anderson,

Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That By-Law No. 673 being a by-law for the purpose of authorizing the holding of nominations and if necessary an election, having been read the first time be now considered as having

• been read the second and third time and passed, and that the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to sign and seal same. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Anderson,
Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That this Council purchase
\$6,000.00 worth of Victory Bonds of the fifth Victory Loan issue. Carried.

The Reeve discussed the early closing by-law with the Council
but the subject was left in abeyance for the present.

Bills and accounts were presented to the Finance Committee,
the Finance Committee reported that the Treasurer is hereby authorized
to pay the accounts as per list.

Moved by Councillor Davidson,
Seconded by Councillor Stevenson,

That the report of the
Finance Committee be accepted and the Reeve and Clerk issue cheques for
the several amounts. Carried.

The meeting then adjourned to meet on November 19th unless
other arrangements were made on November 9th.
