The question of raising the Silver Plains Ferry out of the ice was discussed and the following resolution passed:

Messrs. F. L. Moody and J. H. Kastner interviewed the Council in connection with weeds on road allowances. It was the opinion of the Council that farmers hauling screenings from elevators in open trucks or wagons were responsible to a certain extent for spreading weeds. The Clerk was instructed to write to the Department of Agriculture and obtain more information regarding same.

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee, the Finance Committee reported that the Treasurer is authorized to pay the accounts as per list.
