Insurance endorsement re.ferries.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris held its' regular meeting on the above date at the Court House building at Morris, Man., All members being present, the Secretary read the minutes of the last meeting, which were adopted as being commect by motion of Councillors Anderson and Thiessen. CARRIED.

A letter from Osler, Hammond & Nanton was read in which they advised that there would be an additional cost of \$35.00 to have insurance coverage on the two ferries and the following motion passed:

McDomald - Davidson:

That we hereby agree to take out additional insurance covering our ferries with Public Liability and Property Damage Caverage.CARRIED.

A letter re.Prairie Farm Assistance was read, advising that if assistance was to be paid to farmers of the Municipality, application was to be made, not later than Sept.15th next and the following motion passed with regard to same.

Anderson - Thiessen:

That we make application to have the whole of this Municipality included under the Prairie farm assistance Act for the year 1947, due to the fact that a low yield is anticipated due to damage caused by hail, excess rains Etc. CARRIED.

Councillors Disvenson and McDonald reported that they were in need of culverts for their respective wards and by motion of Councillors Thiessen and Davidson, Councillor Stevenson was authorized to purchase One 24'-18 " culvert, 2 extensions 10' long 18" with couplings and 2-18'-18" culverts with couplings and Councillor McDonald was authorized to purchase 1-20'-18" culvert, 1-30'-12" culvert and 1-18'-12" culvert.CARRIED.

Some discussion took place with regard to the necessity of having some accommodation for the Drag-line operators for sleeping in and the following motion passed re-same:

Anderson - McDonald:

That the Municipality purchase a Caboose or Tent for the men working on the Drag-Line. CARRIED.

The Secretary was asked to write the Mennonite home for invalides at Steinbach with regard to having Mr.Dyck, now at the Nightingale Nursing home in Winnipeg, transferred to the home.

Bills and accounts were handed to the finance committee, who reported that the Treasurer be authorized to pay same as per list.

While the Finance Committee was passing the accounts the Reeve and other Members of the Council left to interview the solicitors with regard to Municipal Liability re-approaches at farmers driveways. Etc., and returned later to the meeting. A letter from P.H. Penner was read regarding his approach.

Thiessen - Davidson:

That the accounts amounting to the sum of \$4,112.45 approved by the Finance Committee, be passed and the Reeve and clerk be hereby authorized to issum cheques for the several amounts. CARRIED.

The Secretary informed the Council that the Hospital Ledger should be thoroughly gone through and accounts deemed uncollectable written off. It was suggested that the Council hold a special meeting after harvest for the purpose of same.

The meeting then adjourned, next meeting to be held in the Court House Building at Morris, September 19th, next.
