The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris met for the regular monthly meeting on the above date in the Court House in the Town of Morris. All members with the exception of Councillors Stevenson and Ribordy were present. The Secretary read the minutes of the last meeting, which were adopted as being correct by motion of Councillors Neufeld and Collette. CARRIED.

Councillor Stevenson to order culvts. Davidson - Anderson: That Councillor Stevenson be authorized to purchase all culverts for the Aubigny - Rosenort Road. CARRIED.

Dragline rentals to be returned to D.M. Bds. Reeve Heppner advised the Council that he was in need of more money for the Drainage Maintenance Boards for Drainage work. Neufeld - Collette: That any monies received from the Drainage Maintenance Boards for Drag-Line rentals be returned to the Boards for drainage work. CARRIED.

O.A. Pension Abram Wiens Neufeld - Davidson: That the application of Abram Wiens for Old Age Pension be recommended to the Old Age Pensions Board for acceptance. CARRIED.

Councillor Davidson to order Culvts. Councillor Davidson advised that he was in need of more culverts for his Ward. Anderson - Collette: That Councillor Davidson be authorized to purchase one 18" by 6' culvert and two couplers, one 18" by 8' culvert and one coupler, and one 24" by 8' culvert and coupler. CARRIED.

BY-LAW # 740 Nominations By-Law No. 740 was read a first time. Neufeld - Davidson:

That BY-LAW No. 740, being a BY-LAW for the purpose of holding nominations for Councillors for 1949 and 1950, having been read the first time, be now considered as having been read the second and third times, and passed, and the Reeve and Clerk be hereby authorized to sign and seal same. CARRIED.

Piling from Geo. Gratton. Neufeld - Davidson: That we purchase the piling which Geo. Gratton left at the Morris Mill for the sum of \$40.00. CARRIED.

BY-Law # 741 Re: Drains BY-LAW No. 741 was read a first time. Davidson - Anderson:

That BY-LAW No. 741, being a BY-Law for the purpose of constructing, opening, and making a drain over Sections 29 & 30 in Township 4, Range 2 West, having been read the first time, be now considered as having been read the second and third times, and passed, and the Reeve and Clerk be hereby authorized to sign and seal same. CARRIED.

Ingot-Iron grader to be sold. Discussion took place with regard to selling the Ingot-Iron Blade Grader. Collette - Anderson:

That the Municipality sell the Ingot-Iron Blade Grader at the auction sale of Harry Anderson. CARRIED.

Innoculations Reeve Heppner reported that children in the western part of this Municipality should be inoculated against contagious diseases this year. Anderson - Collette:

That Reeve Heppner and Councillors Neufeld and Davidson be a committee of three to make arrangements with Dr. Holowin with regard to inoculating the children in the Municipality of Morris. Carried.

Assesments to be added to roll & taxed. Davidson - Anderson: That the assessments of the C. N. R. property and C. P. R. property, W. Schellenberg and H. C. Voth as given by the assessor, be placed on the Tax Roll and Taxes computed accordingly, and that Tax Notices on same for 1948 be mailed respectively. CARRIED.

Mr. Cummers of the Brandram-Henderson Paint Co. met the council and asked that we purchase paint from them for the Red River Bridge. It was decided to consult the Department as to this paint.

A letter from the Canadian Pacific Railway Co. was read, in which they asked that a culvert be installed in the approach to their McTavish Station. The Secretary was asked to advise them that this would be attended to.

A letter from L. A. Slater was read, in which he asked that a refund of Taxes be given to Henry H. Dueck as his buildings were removed from the property during this year. The Secretary was instructed to advise Mr. Slater that no refund would be made.

As the Chairman of the Finance Committee, Councillor Stevenson, was  
absent, Councillor Anderson acted in his stead.

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee, who reported  
that the Secretary-Treasurer should be authorized to pay same as per list.

Davidson - Neufeld;

That the accounts amounting to the sum of \$13,054.98,  
approved by the Finance Committee be passed and the Reeve and Secretary-Treasurer  
be hereby authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts.

CARRIED.

The meeting then adjourned, next meeting to be held in the Court House  
at Morris on October 8th, 1948, commencing at 10.00 O'Clock A.M., Court of  
Revision of the assessment roll to be held in the afternoon.
