The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris met for the regular monthly meeting on the above date in the Court House in the Town of Morris. All members attended at the meeting. The Secretary read the minutes of the last meeting, which were adopted as being correct by motion of Councillors Stevenson & Neufeld.

Bills & Accts.

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee, who reported that the Treasurer should be authorized to pay same as per list.

Neufeld - Ribordy;

That the accounts amounting to the sum of \$37,837.73, approved by the Finance Committee and all subsequent 1949 accounts, which have been approved, be passed, and the Reeve and Clerk be hereby authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts.

CARRIED.

Delegations.

A delegation of nine and headed by Mr. J.M. McDonald met the Council with regard to having St. Marys' road from Aubigny to the Northern boundary of this Municipality raised & gravelled. They were advised that some of the residents from that area were wanting a new ferry placed at Union Point, but that it was not possible for this Municipality to give both the gravelled road and a new ferry. It was agreed that we should wait to hear the next delegation re. the ferry.

A delegation of seven and headed by Mr. Atkins met the Council with regard to having a new ferry placed at Union Point that ferry service across the Red River at that point could be had. They were advised of the Request re. the grading and graveling of St. Marys' road and asked to have a delegation meet with the Council and a delegation re. the grading and graveling of St. Marys' road at the first meeting of the council to be held on Jan. 3rd, 1950.

A delegation from Sewell met the Council with regard to having a road built and gravelled to connect Sewell with # 75 highway. They were advised that they should get together with their Councillor and the District Engineer to agree on the route that should be graded and gravelled and ask for assistance from the Province re. same.

A delegation of 8 and headed by Mr. Bunkowski met the Council and requested that Councillor Stevenson continue on as Councillor, to which Councillor Stevenson agreed. They also asked that a bridge E. of 27-6-1W. be replaced, this was agreed to.

MacKenzie - Collette;

That J.L. Granger be paid for 5,021 yards of gravel placed on the Aubigny - Rosenort road; 123 yds in the Village of Aubigny; 319 yds. in the Village of Rosenort and 16 yds. at Silver Plains at \$ 2.49 per yard. The Secretary to send account to J. Loewen of Rosenort for  $\frac{1}{2}$  the cost of the gravel spread in the Village of Rosenort.

CARRIED.

A dinner was held in the Commercial Hotel, where members of the Council gathered together with past members of Council and where a presentation of an occasional chair was made to Reeve Heppner. Several of the past members were called on to speak. Mr. Heppner expressed his appreciation for the presentation and dinner on his behalf.

In the afternoon, Mr. Heppner was asked to leave the Chambers for a few minutes, upon his return, by motion of Councillors Stevenson & Davidson, he was presented with a \$200.00 cheque by Councillor Stevenson. Mr. Heppner again assured the members that he had enjoyed their fine co-operation in the Council and expressed his sincere thanks.

The meeting then adjourned, next meeting to be held in the Court House at Morris on January 3rd, 1950, commencing at 10.00 O'Clock A.M.
