Minutes. The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris met for the regular monthly meeting on the above date in the Court House in the Town of Morris. The Reeve declaring the meeting open, the Secretary read the minutes of the last meeting, which were adopted as being correct by motion of Councillors Stevenson and Collette. All members of the Council attended at the meeting. CARRIED.
MacKenzie - Neufeld;

To apply for Prairie Farm Assistance. That the Clerk be instructed to make application to the Prairie Farm Assistance Board, to have the whole of the Municipality apply for assistance under the Prairie Farm Assistance Act for the year 1950. CARRIED.
Neufeld - Ribordy;

To request Govt. to supply gravel for L.F. & Sperling. That the Manitoba Government be requested to supply and spread gravel on the side streets in Lowe Farm and Sperling, as the said streets were badly damaged with stock being hauled over them while the 1950 flood was on. Carried.
MacKenzie - Stevenson;

Resolution to R.R.V. Board. Be it resolved, and it is hereby resolved, that due to the 1950 flood, Mr. Wm. Stevensons' buildings have been left in such condition that the present site should be condemned and the buildings moved to a higher level. Also that Mr. Chas. Snarrs' building site be condemned as at its' present level and said site should be raised that his buildings be on a higher level. That the cost of same be borne by the Red River Valley Board. Carried.
Stevenson - Neufeld;



Agreed to Morris Hosp. Debentures. That we hereby acquiesce with the Board of the Morris Hospital District # 25 and the Minister of Health and Public Welfare, to reduce the debenture issue from thirty (30) to twenty (20) years. Carried.
Ribordy - Davidson;

Grant to Peace Gardens. That the Municipality give a grant of fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars to the International Peace Gardens. Carried.
Ribordy - Neufeld;

Sperling Cemetery road. That Councillor Ribordy be authorized to spent \$250.00 for grevelling the Sperling cemetery road. Carried.
Bills and Accts. the Treasurer should be authorized to pay same as per list. Carried.
Neufeld - Davidson;

Correspondence. That the accounts amounting to the sum of \$26,567.77, approved by the Finance Committee be passed, and the Reeve and Secretary-Treasurer be hereby authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts. Carried.
A letter from the Richardson Road Machinery Co., was read, in which they advised that \$250.00 was charged on their books against this Municipality for a back-sloper and that if we wished to keep this equipment, they would let us have same for \$150.00. The Secretary was asked to advise them that we did not want the back-sloper.
A letter from the Dept. of Public Works was read, in which they asked that an account of \$73.39 re. work done on the Morris-Minto road this year, be paid to them. The Secretary-Treasurer advised the Council that he had written the Dept., that as this account was for work done this year, we did not see that we should pay it, as the Dept. took the road over last fall.
A letter from the Canadian Red Cross re. an account of the Rosenort Garage in the amount of \$ 225.00 was read, in which they advised that they did not see where either the Red Cross or this Municipality should be liable for same. The Clerk was asked to advise the Rosenort Garage that we would not pay this account.

Delegations. Mr. Budzak of the Vulcan Machinery & Equipment Co., attended at the meeting and spoke to the Council re. their Motor Graders.
Mr. Keating of the Richardson Road Machinery attended at the meeting with regard to their machinery.
A representative of the Powell Equipment Company attended at the meeting with regard to machinery of that company.
Mr. Omer LaFerriere attended at the meeting with regard to his property at Silver Plains on which there is a Hospital Lien lodged re. his father. He was advised that it would appear that the lien was in order and that it should be paid by him.
Mrs. Richard attended at the meeting re. a place for her to live and assistance by way of aid from the Municipality, she was advised that the Council would go to Aubigny on Aug. 19th and see what could be done for her.
Mr. Mousseau of Aubigny attended at the meeting with regard to damage done to his property from where earth for the ferry road was taken. He was advised that the Council would view same on Aug. 19th.
A delegation of three and headed by Mr. Harder interviewed the Council with regard to drainage in Twp. 4 Range 1 W., they were advised that recommendations would be made to the Drainage Maintenance Board re. same.
The meeting then adjourned, next meeting to be held in the Court House at Morris on Friday, September 8th, commencing at 10.00 A.M.
