They also advised that all surpluses would be turned back to the Rurel Municipality and Town of Morris. 2/3 to the R.M.of Morris and 1/3 to the Town of Morris.

A copy of Order-in-Council 1571/50 was read, in which the Province advised that a speed limit of 30.miles per hour would be in force on the highway through the Village of Lowe Farm.

A letter from Mrs. Thiessen was read, in which she asked for more relief, the matter was referred to Councillor Davidson.
