That the Reeve, The Secretary and assistant Secret ary, if she so wishes to attend, attend the extension course in Municipal Administra tion and Public Finance put on by the Government June 4th to 8th inclusive, actual expenses to be paid by the Municipality.

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee, who reported that the Treasurer should be authorized to pay same as per list.

That the accounts amounting to the sum of \$16,238.31, approved by the Finance Committee be passed, and the Reeve and Treasurer be authori-CARRIED. zed to issue cheques for the several amounts.

C.C.Peck attended at the meeting re.dmaining Horse - Shoe lake.He was advised the matter would be looked into.

Wm.Stevenson attended at the meeting and asked that our equipment do some private work for him. He was advised that this would be done as soon as the weather permits.

Mr. Breyfogle attended at the meeting and asked that the Dragline be allowed to do some private work for him. He was advised that it would be done when the dragline was near the locations where the work was to be done.

Mrs. Thiessen attended at the meeting and asked for foot-wear for her children, it was agreed that she should be allowed to purchase up to \$15.00 worth at this time.

A letter from the Manitoba Federation of Agriculture and Co-operation was read, in which they asked permission to hold a tag-day in the Municipality on June 23rd, it was agreed that permission should be granted.

A letter from W.G.Coventry, United Kingdom Trade Commissioner was read, in which he advised that the manner in which we were carrying out the distribution of the gifts from Britain, was satisfactory.

The meeting then adjourned, next meeting to be held in the Court House at Morris on Monday June 11th, commencing at the hour of 10.00 O'Clock in the forencon.
