Minutes. The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris met in the Court House in the Town of Morris on the above date for the purpose of holding the August meeting as per Minute of the September meeting. The Reeve declaring the meeting open, the Secretary read the minutes of the last regular meeting, which were adopted as being correct by motion of Councillors Saurette & M.J. Stevenson. CARRIED.

Petition re. Union Point & Provencher School Dists. A petition signed by residents of the Union Point School District and the Provencher School District was read, in which they asked that certain properties be detached from Union Point School District and added to Provencher School District for the reason that there is no ferry at Union Point for crossing the children to and from school.  
Neufeld - Saurette;  
That the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris is agreeable to have River Lots 482, 484, 486, 488, 490, 492, 494 & 496 transferred from the Union Point School District to the Provencher School District # 997. CARRIED.

C.P.R. Cattleguards. A letter from a Superintendent of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company was read, in which he asked relief from this Municipality from the Railway Company maintaining cattle guards at road crossings as per list attached to his letter.

That the Board of Transport Commissioners for Canada be requested to relieve the Canadian Pacific Railway Company from maintaining cattleguards at the highway crossings in the Rural Municipality of Morris as per attached list, and that a certified copy of this resolution be sent to the Board. CARRIED.

Dept. Magnet to be asked for & Black-Top Marais Bridge. Saurette - M.J. Stevenson;  
That the Government be requested to run their magnet over some of the flooded roads in this Municipality, and that they also be requested to black-top the Marais Bridge on the Morris-Dufrost road. CARRIED.

Tenders to be asked for, for gravelling. That the Secretary be requested to call for tenders for gravelling the Aubigny-Rosenort road with 500 yards of gravel per mile, The St. Marys' road from Aubigny five miles north with 300 yards of gravel per mile and 7 miles of the Morris-Dufrost road, the amount per mile to be determined before notices or tenders are posted. Tenders to be posted by Sept. 1st and to close at noon Sept. 14th, 1951. CARRIED.


Bills & Accts. Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee, who reported that the Treasurer should be authorized to pay same as per list.

That the accounts amounting to the sum of \$22,132.92, approved by the Finance Committee be passed and the Reeve and Secretary-Treasurer be hereby authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts. CARRIED.

Tenders to be asked for, for painting R.R. Bridge. That the Secretary be requested to call for tenders for scraping & painting the Red River Bridge at Morris, paint to be supplied by the Municipality. Tenders to close at Noon Sept. 14th, 1951. CARRIED.

Correspondence. The Secretary read a letter from the Prairie Farm Assistance, in which they advised that the whole of Township five and Range one East, was eligible for assistance for the year 1950.  
A letter from the Town of Steinbach was read, in which they advised that Miss Elizabeth Wiebe had moved to the Rural Municipality of Hanover, and was not now receiving relief.  
A letter from the Surveys Branch of the Department of Public Works was read, in which they advised that they had located certain mounds in Township four, Range one East and Township five, range two West. That if any of them are pulled out the Department will not undertake replacing them without charge. That Municipal Officials should do everything possible to protect the Mounds and survey monuments.

The meeting then adjourned, next meeting to be held in the Court House at Morris on Friday, September 14th, 1951, commencing at the hour of 10.00 O'Clock in the forenoon.
