> Saurette-Bunkowsky: Whereas municipalities and local government districts in Manitoba may not assess or tex mines and minerals in land by virtue of Sec 991(d)

of the Municipal Act, and Whereas if land the title to which includes mines and minerals is sold for taxes and is not redeemed, then upon vesting of title for the land to the tax sale purchaser or his assignee, such mines and minerals revert to The Crown by virtue of Sec. 49A of The Real Property Act as enacted by Cap. 52, S.M. 1949; and

Whereas it is felt that, although mines and minerals may not be taxed as aforesaid, land and all mines and minerals included in the title levied on land by a municipality or local government district in the same manner and to the same extent as a mortgage can secure land and all mines and minerals included in the mortgagor

Mines & Mineral rights be obtaind therefor;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that Her Majesty the Queen be petitioned and entreated to amend by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba Section 49A of The Real Property and Section 991 (d) of the Municipal Act so that where land is sold by a municipality or local government district for arrears of taxes such sale shall include all mines and minerals in the same extent as they may be included in the title for the land at the time of the sale, and if the land is not redeemed then a person, a municipality or a local government district who or which purchases the land at tax sales or otherwise becomes entitled thereto as an assignee of a tax sale purchases, shall become the owner of the mines and minerals to the same extent and in the same manner as they may have been included in the title for the land at the time of the tax sale.

AND FURTHER that such amendment govern all dealings with such land made between the first day of May 1945 and the date of this amendment and that any titles issued to any applicant for tax title reserving said mines and minerals to the Crown under and by Virtue of these sections as previously written be rectified and altered accordingly.

Ribordy-Bunkowsky: That the accounts as approved by the Finance Committee be passed and the Reeve & Sec.-Treas. be hereby authorized to pay same.
