

Morris, Manitoba
May 13, 1955

The Council of The Rural Municipality of Morris held its regular monthly meeting on the above date with all members present. The meeting was declared opened by Reeve C. J. Neufeld after which the Secretary read the minutes of the April 6th meeting which were adopted as read by motion of "Recksiedler and Bunkowsky".

- Legion Wreath H.B.Giesbrecht-Otto Bunkowsky: That we purchase a wreath for the Decoration Day Services to be held on Sunday, June 19th, on behalf of the Morris Branch of the Canadian Legion. Carried.
- Painting Municipal House Recksiedler-Schellenberg: That we accept the tender of L. Jobin of St. Jean to paint the Municipal House, Garage and Out-building with 2 coats of paint at a price not to exceed \$180.00. Carried
- C.P.R. Fencing Sewell & Osborne Recksiedler-Bunkowsky: That the Board of Transport Commissioners for Canada be requested to relieve the Canadian Pacific Railway Company from maintaining right of way fence: on the South side of the LaRiviere Subdivision from mileage 44.0 to mileage 48.0 and on the North side of the LaRiviere Subdivision from mileage 29.6 to mileage 30.6, and that a certified copy of this resolution be sent to the said Board. Carried.
- Sperling Station Ribordy-Giesbrecht: That the Council of The Rural Municipality of Morris strongly objects to granting the Canadian National Railways the right to close as an agency their station at Sperling. Carried.
- Adopting Electors' Roll Recksiedler-Giesbrecht: That the 1954 Electors' Roll be adopted for the year 1955 as per Sec. 50(3 & 4) of The Municipal Act and the Court of Revision in respect to same be held on July 8th, from 2 p.m. to 3 p.m. in the Court House Building Morris, Man., and the Secretary-Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to amend the last revised List of Electors as per Sec. 52(3) of The Municipal Act. Carried
- Sec.-Treas. Course Bunkowsky-Recksiedler: That the Secretary and Assistant Secretary-Treasurer be delegated to attend the Course in Municipal Administration and Public Finance, to be held June 20th to June 24th and expenses re same be paid by the Municipality. Carried
- Grant re Polio Pool Giesbrecht-Bunkowsky: That we grant \$100.00 to the Polio Rehabilitation Hydro-therapy Pool Project of the Princess Elizabeth Hospital. Carried.
- By-Law 815 Compulsory Bangs Disease Schellenberg-Giesbrecht: That By-Law No. 815 being a By-Law for the purpose to provide for the compulsory treatment of cattle by calfhood vaccination for the Prevention of Bangs Disease, cost of which is to be borne by the Municipality and the Provincial Government, having been read a first time, be now considered as having been read a second and third time and passed and the Reeve and Sec.-Treasurer are hereby authorized to sign and seal same. Carried
- Veterinary Surgeon Ribordy-Giesbrecht: That we appoint Dr. L.F.Marcoux, Morris, as the Veterinary Surgeon for the Municipality of Morris, to carry out the vaccination program for Bangs Disease at the fee of \$1.00 per female calf. Carried.
- Accounts Recksiedler-Ribordy: That the accounts as approved by the Finance Committee for \$9,358.30 be passed and the Reeve and Sec.-Treasurer are hereby authorized to pay same. Carried.

The meeting adjourned and the next regular meeting will be held on Friday, JUNE 10, at 10 a.m.

SPECIAL MEETING - Morris, Man. May 16, 1955

A special meeting of Council was held on the above date at 7 p.m. for the purpose of leasing property to open a gravel pit.

Reeve C.J. Neufeld and Councillors Bunkowsky, Recksiedler and Saurette were present and discussed the matter with Ulric St. Godard & sons from St. Jean.

"Bunkowsky-Recksiedler": That we enter into an agreement with Ulric St. Godard of St. Jean, Manitoba, to lease : Part of the SE 33-4-2 RPM for three years, for the purpose of opening a gravel pit and pay him the price of 25¢ a yard for gravel removed, if same is found in satisfactory and sufficient quantity."
