

THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS

May 10, 1968

The Council of The Rural Municipality of Morris held its regular monthly meeting on the above date with all members present. Moved by G.P.Goossen, seconded by G. Cretton that the minutes of April 11th Council meeting be adopted as read.

H.D.Earl-G.P.Goossen: That By-Law No. 973 regarding the Morris Planning Scheme 1968, having received no objections from the ratepayers or electors in the designated area, be now read a second time and submitted to the Minister of Urban Development and Municipal Affairs for approval. Carried

H.D.Earl-W.F.Recksiedler: That By-Law No. 974, being a by-law for the purpose of making estimates of the sums required for the lawful purposes of the corporation for the year 1968 and setting out the various rates as shown in "Schedule A" having been read a first time, be now read a second and third time and passed. Carried

G.P.Goossen: That we instruct our architect to order an exterior sign for the Municipal building, listing the various offices housed in this building; taking the quotation of Martel-Stewart Western Ltd. of \$395.00 Carried

Gib. Cretton-Ben Klassen: That we authorize the removal of the Women's Institute marker from the municipal grounds, due to same being badly deteriorated; and approve the installation of the Dept. of Agriculture sign at this location. Carried

Ed. Saurette-H. Earl: That By-Law No. 975 being a by-law for the purpose of leasing office space to the Morris-Macdonald School Division and to the Morris-Montcalm Weed Control District, having been read a first time, be now read a second and third time and passed. Carried

W.F.Recksiedler-E. Saurette: That we build a suitable counter for the customer space in the office of the Dept. of Agriculture and permit this department to install extra shelving in the storage space at its own expense. Carried

Ben Klassen-H.D.Earl: That we request the Highways Department to investigate the possibility of erecting a Roadside Park on PTH #23 in the corner of Section 3, Township 5, Range 1 W.P.M. Carried

Ed. Saurette-H.D.Earl: That we request the Manitoba Hydro to replace two existing lights in the Village of Aubigny on P.Road 246 with one 175 Watt Mercury Vapor Light. Carried

G.P.Goossen-E.Saurette: That we request the Highways Department to give immediate attention to improve P.R. 205 from the junction of PR 422 to PR 330. Carried

H. D. Earl-Gib Cretton: That we authorize the purchase of wire fencing for the Municipal Storage Yard. Carried

G. Cretton-H.D.Earl: That we authorize the Reeve and Secretary-Treasurer to make a loan up to \$50,000.00 from the Bank of Montreal, if and when required. Carried

H. D. Earl-B.Klassen: That the accounts as approved by the finance committee for \$32,352.18 be passed for payment. Carried


Reeve Zeph Audette and Councilor Glenn Baldwin attended the meeting to discuss inter-municipal road and drainage problems between DeSalaberry & Morris municipalities. All approved projects to be shared on a 50/50 basis.


