

THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS

March 17, 1969

The Council of The Rural Municipality of Morris held its regular monthly meeting on the above date with all members present. It was moved by H. Earl, seconded by Geo Goossen that the minutes of Feb. 14th Council Meeting be adopted as read.

Gib Cretton-Harold Earl: That we request the Fire Commissioner's department to give fire prevention instructions to our Volunteer Fire Brigades, namely: Lowe Farm, Sperling and Rosenort, during the early part of June. Carried

Ben Klassen-Gib Cretton: That we contract with Johnny Dueck, Morris, to truck, load and crush our gravel requirements for 1969 at the following rates:

Hauling at $8\frac{1}{2}$ cents a yard per mile
and 60 cents a yard for crushing and
loading on trucks. Carried

W.F.Recksiedler-Gib Cretton: That we appoint the following Councillors as our members to the Pembina Valley Development Corporation:

Harold D. Earl and Bernhard Klassen. Carried

Gib Cretton-Ben Klassen: That we subscribe to one page of advertising space in the 1969 Prize List of the Valley Agricultural Society. Carried

H.D.Earl-M.A.Caron: That the accounts as approved by the Finance Committee for \$23,640.21 be passed for payment. Carried


The Morris and Lowe Farm Women's Institutes requested a survey to be made regarding the construction of a "Personalized Care Home." Council will check with neighboring municipalities in our Hospital District as to their feelings in this matter.

Council gave consideration to the passing of a by-law which would prevent or limit to a specified area and regulate, the erection of slaughter houses, Piggeries, Rendering Plants, Chicken and Livestock barns.


Reeve C. Anderson reported on the Brief presented to the Federal Government regarding the development of the Pembina River Basin, as sponsored by the "Lower Red River Valley Water Commission".

The predicted 1969 Flood threat for our area received attention. A Municipal Survey of those farms that could be seriously affected by a flood at the 1966 level has been completed. Further action will be taken after government departments have made its predictions known.
