M.A.Caron-W.F.Recksiedler: That we sell a used pile driver head and cap Sale Pile to Western Building of Manitou for the sum of \$350.00 Driver head.

H.D. Earl-M. Caron: That we agree to share with the Provincial Government Drugs re on a 50/50 basis, them cost of Life Saving Drugs required by "Namey" daughter of Allan Snarr's of Morris, Man.

Seeding Ben Klassen-W. Recksiedler: That we contract with Jake Peters, Morris, Drain, ditchesto seed Drainage ditches (new) at \$3.50 an acre.
