Peter Isaak, used an aerial map to describe the proposed system. Also in attendance was Agricultural Representative, Cliff Harrison, and the following eleven ratepayers: Ken Rhymer, Lloyd Rhymer, Wayne Rhymer, George Thompson, Alfred Thompson, Orville Famulener, Vernon Thompson, Murray Thompson, Melvin Elliot, Edward Burstahler, and Denis Robert.

The upgrading of the Roberts-McTavish drains would allow summer rains to be drained away quickly. Water Resources would upgrade the six miles of main drain, while the Municipality would be responsible for improving and maintaining the lateral drains. George Thompson remarked that there was no sense in improving drainage into the Red River until the Red is deepened so that it can handle more water without flooding. Orville Famulener mentioned the need for bigger culverts under P.T.H. No. 75. Dave Brown stated that Water Resources were attending the meeting, at Council's request, and if they were not satisfied with their report, a private Consultant could be hired. He said hopefully the designs would take off a 3 or 4 inch rain, and that they were not intended to stop all flooding.

It was decided that a committee would be set up, to work with Cliff Harrison to suggest drainage projects that would be eligible for the currently available federal-provincial funding.

Peter Isaak also discussed the approach at the North entrance of the Rosenort ring dyke.

Water Resources concluded their presentations at 3 P.M.
