That Mr J. H. Bestwick be appointed as Rivers Weed Inspector for season 1934, without ^{monthly} salary, but to be paid for the necessary work done in connection with appointment. (Carried)

A petition was received from the Lone Farm district asking that the Council furnish feed for ^{the horses} this the Council declined to do.

The condition of the capelin at the Union Point ferry was discussed also the advisability of parking the ferry at that point. after a discussion the following resolution was passed.

That the Clerk be instructed to call for tenders to build a capelin at the Union Point ferry. also tenders for parking the Union Point ferry. tenders to be in by March 3rd (Carried)

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee the finance Committee reported that the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay accounts as per list.
