

A regular meeting of the Council was held on the above date present the Reeve and all the Council

The minutes of former meeting were read and declared adopted as read.

A large delegation from the South East portion of the Municipality interviewed the Council in connection with Red and feed the Council were unable to grant their request.

As several requests for the renting of hay land from the Municipality were received the Council discussed same and the following resolution was passed
 moved by Councillor Sevan
 seconded " Stevenson

That the Clerk be instructed to call for tenders for hay privileges on all vacant land held by the Municipality the purchaser paying one half of the amount before commencing operations and the balance on or before Oct 1st 1931.
 (Carried)

Dr Boyd of Morris spoke to the Council in connection with the examination of the school children's teeth in the different schools throughout the Municipality. The Clerk was instructed to take the matter up with the Provincial Board of Health to ascertain what arrangements could be made.

The application of Mrs Marguerite Buhette for old age pension was received and the following resolution was passed
 moved by Councillor Leblond
 seconded " Rame

That the application of Mrs Marguerite Buhette for old age pension be recommended.
 (Carried)

H. D. Durken spoke to the Council in connection with renting a house at Winkler man. He stated he had to vacate the place were he was living and if he could secure a house in Winkler he would be able to secure work cutting wood. He stated it was necessary to pay the rent for six months in advance and he needed \$12.00 to do this.

after a discussion the following resolution was passed
 moved by Councillor Durken
 seconded " Rame

That this Council pay the rent for H. D. Durken for three months to the amount of \$12.00 payable to G. A. Deppner of Hornsea.
 (Carried)

Julius Marsh interviewed the Council he stated that he had to vacate the house he was living in and he could secure another place if the Council would advance the sum of

20th to pay the rent for six months. He agreed to reimburse the Municipality as soon as work was secured. The Municipality agreed to the proposition.

The matter of Relief was brought up and it was decided to hold a meeting of the Relief Committee on Saturday evening April 20th at 8 p.m. to consider only destitute cases.

A plan of the Swamp Oil Company proposed switch to the refinery was shown to the Council asking for the approval of the Council. After a discussion the following resolution was passed moved by Councillor Sheverson

seconded " Swain

That the plan as submitted by the Swamp Oil Co be approved by this Council and the Reeve and the Clerk be authorized to sign and seal the same. (Carried)

A copy of the recommendations of the Drainage Committee to the Provincial Government was read and a recommendation as follows was passed

moved by Councillor Rance

seconded " Sheverson

That this Council request the Provincial Government to adopt the recommendations of the Drainage Districts Committee as in their report of February 15th 1934. (Carried)

Councillor Swain introduced a resolution asking that a portion of the present levy on the Bridge Area amounting to 3 $\frac{2}{3}$ cents per acre be taken from the Bridge Area and imposed on all the lands in the Municipality not in the Drainage areas or Bridge Area

after a discussion on the subject the resolution was voted on and defeated.

Applications for reestablishment under the back to the land scheme were received from R. Bogart and R. Swain but the Council were unable to act on the suggestion

Several communications were received in connection with prices on Bridge timber etc also a communication was read to the Council in connection with relief transactions

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee the Finance Committee reported the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the accounts as per list.

moved by Councillor Rance

seconded " Sheverson

That the report of the Finance Committee be accepted and the Reeve and Clerk issue cheques for the several amounts Carried.
