

Rural Municipality of Morris,

Morris, Man. April 12th. 1935.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on the above date, present the Reeve and all the Council.

The minutes of former meeting held March 15th. were read and declared adopted as read.

A petition was received from Messrs, Martens, Koop, Olfert Etc, asking that another school district be formed from four sections taken from the Lone-Star S.D. and two sections from Neufeld S.D. together with one section from Tremont S.D.

The Council after discussing the subject with the Petitioner's for some time decided to leave the matter in abeyance until such time as the question could be taken up with the Trustee's of Lone Star S.D.

The question of continuing consolidation of tax arrears for the year 1935 was taken up by the Council and the following resolution was passed after the by-law was read the first time.

Moved by Councillor Clubb,

Seconded by Councillor McDonald,

That by-law No.553 being a by-law for the purpose of not entering into consolidation of tax arrears for the year 1935, having been read the first time, be now considered as having been read the second and third time and passed and the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to sign and seal the same.

(Carried)

The question of the immunization of the School Children in the South-West portion of the Municipality was again discussed and the following resolution passed.

Moved by Councillor Thiesen,

Seconded by Councillor Stevenson,

That this Council apply to the Health Authorities to have the Children immunized against diptheria in the School Districts of Lowe-Farm, Rosefarm, Kronsweide, and Steinfeld .

(Carried)

A communication was received from Mrs, John J. Weins asking for assistance from the Council, the Clerk was instructed to advise her that as her husband had neglected to support her it was a matter to be dealt with by the Court.

The Council were advised that it was necessary to secure another residence for the P.M. Friesen family, as Mr. Pasche wished to take over the buildings on the McDermott farm, Councillor Snarr was delegated to make the necessary arrangements.

Reeve Stoney explained to the Council that the Drainage Bill had passed the Legislature, and that it allowed for certain adjustments in connection with the levies in the District , he stated that the Committee of which he was Chairman had attended 12 meetings, during the three years.

The Members of the Council stated that they were well satisfied with the result of the Committee so far , and now that the bill was passed hoped that the necessary adjustments would follow.

Moved by Councillor McDonald,

Seconded by Councillor Gehring,

That Reeve Stoney be paid the sum of \$60.00 as payment of his expenses, on the Drainage Committee for the last three years.

(Carried)

Prices were received from a local Implement Dealer in connection with the price of a dragging Engine, after a discussion the Clerk was instructed to ask for prices from all the local dealers on a not less than 15 H.P., tractor fitted with heavy pneumatic tires said prices to be submitted for next regular meeting.

Bills and accounts were handed to the finance Committee the finance committee reported the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the accounts as per list.

Moved by Councillor Gehring,

Seconded by Councillor Thiesen,

That the report of the Finance Committee be accepted and the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts.
