The annual nomination was held in the Court House at Morris on the above date as per the "Municipal Act". At the hour of 2.00 O'Clock P.M. the Secretary declared nominations closed. There being nominations required for the position of the Reeve and Councillors for wards three, five and six. Nomination papers filed were that of B.W. Thiessen for Reeve, C.J. Neufeld for Councillor for ward five and M.L. Ribordy for ward six. As there were no other nominations the candidates as nominated were acclaimed to their respective offices for 1950 and 1951. There being no nomination for ward three, the office remained open for an appointment as provided by the "Municipal Act".

There being a fair number of ratepayers present, the Secretary asked that a Chairman for the meeting be nominated.

Moody - McNulty;

That Be W. Thiessen be Chairman for the Meeting. CARRIED.

Each Councillor was called on in turn and respectively gave a report on their years work and further plans in their wards. Reeve Heppner spoke for ward three in the absence of Councillor Stevenson. Then Reeve Heppner was called on as Reeve and gave a very complete account of the work and financial standing of the Corporation.

Some discussion took place re. gravelling and road building and cost of same. The Reeve advised that to gravel any amount of roads was a very expensive undertaking and could not be done without a much greater grant from the Province for that purpose.

By motion of Messrs Moody and McNulty, a very hearty vote of thanks was given to Mr. Heppner for his lengthy and most tireless services he had given to the Municipality and Council as the Reeve, to which Mr. Heppner most suitably replied.

It was moved by Messrs. McNulty and Moody that the Council interview the Provincial Government re. getting more grants for road building and gravelling. CARRIED.

By motion of Messrs. Ribordy and McNulty, the meeting adjourned.
