Mr. Packer of the Pedlar People attended at the meeting and assured the Council that they would make every effort to fill the culvert and other metal requirements of the municipality with all orders given them this year. He was advised that they would no doubt get a fair share of our business.

Mr. Hink of J.T. Pounder and Co., slso attended at the meeting and solicited culvert business, he was given the same advise as Mr. Packer.

Mr. Moody of Westeel Products attended re. Culverts also, and was advised

that we would give him some of the 1952 business also.

Mr. Jean Combot attended at the meeting with regard to seeking municipal assistance for his mother. He was advised that as she was not on mor needed relief, the Municipality could not give any financial help.

Mr. Outstof Abbigny attended at the meeting and asked that the Council pay a store bill incurred by Mrs. Richard at his store. He was advised that Mrs. Richard would be approached by members of Council re.seme.

Mr. Lewis of the Manitoba Blue Cross Hospital Service attended at the meeting and discussed with Council their suggestions of having more people of

the Province becoming members of the Blue Cross association. Mr. Ted Pollard attended at the meeting and quoted the following praces

A letter from Mr.J.Gurzon Harvey was read, in which he asked that this Mr.J.G.Harvey re Municipality pay \$133.98, being 1/3 the cost of legal fees etc., re.Altona Hospital District Debenture vote. The Clerk was asked to get more details of the account from Mr.Harvey.

A letter from the R.M. of Roland was read in which they asked for a a new account setting out the exact locations of work done. Councillor Neufeld advised that he would get this information, that the accounts between the Two Municipalities could be agreed upon.

In a letter from the Childrens' Aid Society, we were asked to consider a grant to them again this year in our budget.

In a letter from the Carman Hospital District, we were advised that our share of their 1951 deficit was \$498.41., which should be levied for this year. The meeting adjourned about 7.00 P.M.
