

June 13th, 1952.

Minutes.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris met in the Court House in the Town of Morris on the above date for the purpose of holding the regular monthly meeting. Reeve MacKenzie calling the meeting to order, the Secretary read the minutes of the last regular meeting, which were adopted as being correct by motion of Councillors Saurette and Neufeld. CARRIED.

Intermunicipal road to be raised & gravelled - E. of 5-2E.

All members of the Council attended at the meeting. A delegation of Eight people from the East side of the Municipality attended at the meeting and asked that this Municipality together with the R.M. of DeSalaberry pay a part of the cost of raising and graveling one & three quarters mi. of the intermunicipal road, North of the Morris-Dufrost road and agreed to pay \$800.00 toward same.

Saurette - Bunkowsky:

That as people of the eastern side of the Municipality have agreed to pay \$800.00 toward the cost of raising and graveling one and three quarters miles of the intermunicipal road, north of the Morris-Dufrost road, we hereby agree to pay the balance of cost of same on a 50/50 basis with the R.M. of DeSalaberry. said work to be looked after by the R.M. of DeSalaberry. CARRIED.

Neufeld - Reckseidler:

That we ask for tenders for graveling the Sewell road, approximately six miles with 350 yds. of gravel per mile, also the South two miles of St. Marys' road in this Municipality. Successful applicant to supply, haul and spread gravel on said roads. Tenders to close at 12 o'clock noon of June 27th, 1952. CARRIED.

Gravel Tenders asked for.

Stevenson - Bunkowsky:

That the Secretary-Treasurer be delegated to attend the Course in Municipal Administration and Public Finance to be held in the University next week, June 16th to 20th inclusive and his expenses re same be paid by the Municipality. CARRIED.

Sec-Treas. to attend Short Course.

Letters from John F. Groening of Lowe Farm and Dr. Holowin of Morris, stating that Mr. Groening was in need of financial assistance for a greater part of this year, due to his serious accident this year, he is unable to work for some time, were read.

\$45.00 per Mo. aid for John F. Groening.

Neufeld - Ribordy;

That we give aid to John F. Groening of Lowe Farm to the amount of \$45.00 per month. CARRIED.

Neufeld - Saurette;

\$35.00 yard rent to D. Heppner.

That we pay Mr. D. Heppner of Lowe Farm, the sum of \$35.00 for rent of his yard for the years 1950 and 1951. CARRIED.

Bills & Accts.

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee, who reported that the Treasurer should be authorized to pay same as per list.

Neufeld - Bunkowsky;

That the accounts amounting to the sum of \$46,117.03, approved by the Finance Committee be passed, and the Reeve and Secretary-Treasurer be hereby authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts. CARRIED.

Delegations.

Bill Parsons of Vulcan Machinery Co., attended at the meeting with regard to equipment Etc. of his Company he was soliciting sales for.

Correspondence.

A delegation of four from ward three attended at the meeting with regard to the condition of the road one mile south of the northern boundary of the Municipality. They were advised that same would be taken care of as soon as possible.

A letter from the Canadian National Railways, advising that the situation of their crossing conditions would be looked into, was read.

A letter from the Canadian Pacific Railways was read, in which they advised in their opinion, their crossings were in accordance with the necessary requirements.

A letter from the Dept. of Health & Public Welfare was read, in which they advised that a Health Officers Convention was to be held in Winnipeg on June 16th, The Secretary was asked to advise Our Health Officer to that effect.

A letter from R.S. Davidson was read, in which he asked if the Municipality would sell some old bridge planks to him and for what price. The Secretary was asked to advise him that it is the intention of the Council to sell such old bridge plank by public auction in the fall.

The meeting adjourned at about 5.30 P.M., next regular meeting to be held in the Court House in the Town of Morris on July 11th, 1952, commencing at 10.00 o'clock in the forenoon.
