Minutes

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris met in the Court House in the Town of Morris on the above date for the purpose of holding the regular monthly meeting. Reeve MacKenzie declaring the meeting opened, the Secretary read the minutes of the meetings of June 13th & 27th, which were adopted as being correct, by motion of Councillors Bunkowsky and Saurette. CARRIED.

lands in R.M. of MacDonald to be added to Osborne S.D.

A letter from the R.M. of MacDonald was read, in which they asked that certain sections, not being in any school district, be included in the Osborne S.D. Neufeld - Reckseidler :

That we do hereby acquiesce with the Council of the Rural Municipality of MacDonald to have Sections six (6) and Seven (7) and the West half of Section eight (8) in Township seven (7) and Range one (1) East of the Meridian, which are at present in no school district, added to the Osborne School District No. 260. CARRIED.

Caboose to be built.

Stevenson - Ribordy; That we build a caboose size 8 ft. by 16 ft. on our trailer, for use with the dragline. CARRIED.

2 mi. of road to be gravelled by Rosenort.

Bunkowsky - Saurette; That we gravel one (1) mile East of Rosenort and one (1) mile West of Rosenort with 700 yards of gravel at \$2.95 per yard. Johnny Dueck to do this gravelling. CARRIED.

Lot 11, Blk. 3, P. 522 to be purchased

Neufeld - Ribordy; That we purchase lot 11 in block 3 Plan 522 in the Village of Lowe Farm from A.K. Klassen of Lowe Farm, for the sum of five hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, said lot to be used for a fire hall and rest rooms. CARRIED.

Fire hall to be built.

Neufeld - Saurette; That whereas, the people of Lowe Farm and district have finally agreed that they wish a fire hall and Rest Room & fire fighting equipment in Lowe Farm, same be provided as per minute of April 10th, 1952. CARRIED.

Acct. of J. Dueck to be paid.

RIBORDY - NEUFELD; That we pay Johnny Dueck the amount of his gravel contract immediately he completes same and issues his account. CARRIED.

new nuisance ground at Sperling.

Ribordy - Neufeld; That we select a new site for a nuisance ground at Sperling. CARRIED.

More street lights for Sperling.

Ribordy - Bunkowsky; That the Manitoba Power Commission be requested to install a 200 Watt light at the Sperling School entrance and a 200 watt light on the first Hydro pole North of the sachhol. CARRIED.

Electors Roll C. of R. to be Aug. 8th.

Stevenson - Reckseidler; That at 2.00 O'Clock in the afternoon on the 8th day of August next, the Council shall sit as a court of Revision for the purpose of hearing any complaints against the 1952 list of electors. CARRIED.

Bills & Accts.

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee, who reported that the Secretary should be authorized to pay same as per list. Neufeld - Saurette;

That the accounts amounting to the sum of \$26,723.49, approved by the Finance Committee, be passed, and the Reve and Secretary-Treasurer be hereby authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts. CARRIED.

Delegations.

Bill Parsons of Vulcan Machinery attended at the meeting soliciting business re. equipment he had to offer from his Company.

Ken Packer of Pedlar People attended at the meeting and advised that they would welcome any culvert orders and do their utmost to fulfil them.

Correspondence.

A letter from the Manitoba Power Commission was read with which they attached an account for \$1,865.14 for repairing tower damaged by our new elevating grader hitting it. The Secretary was asked to write the power commission that we feel the account was far too high for such work and that the tower was so close to the highway that it is in a hazardous position to traffic on the highway, that either the Power Commission or the Dept. of Public Works must be at fault as to location of the Tower by the Highway.

The meeting then adjourned, next meeting to be held in the Court house in the Town of Norris, commencing at 10.00 O'Clock in the forenoon on Friday the 8th day of August, 1952.
