August 8th, 1952.

Minutes.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris met in the Court House in the Town of Morris on the above date for the purpose of holding the regular monthly meeting. Owing to harvest operations, the meeting was called by the Reeve to commence at 1.00 O'Clock instead of 10.00 O'Clock as usual. The Reeve calling the meeting opened, the Secretary read the minutes of the last meeting, which were adopted as being correct by motion of Councillors Reckseidler and Ribordy. CARRIED.

\$20.00 per Mo. aid re. Arnold Enns.

All members of the Council attended at the meeting. A letter from Mr. J.P. Isaac and supported by him in person, was read, in which he asked that the Municipality give some financial assistance to Mrs. D. Enns in aid of her son Arnold Enns.

Bunkowsky - Neufeld;  
That we give Mrs. D. Enns assistance in the sum of \$ 20.00 per month as aid in keeping her son "Arnold". CARRIED.  
Reckseidler - Stevenson;

\$420.00 office rent for /52.

That we pay \$ 420.00 to the Court House Committee for office rent for the year 1952. CARRIED.

C. of R. re. Electors' Roll.

The Council sat as a Court of Revision to hear any complaints against the 1952 list of Electors as per minute of July 11th. CARRIED.

Apply to have Miss E. Wiebe placed in home.

That the Court of Revision re. the Electors' Roll do now close and the Electors' Lists as printed be the lists for the year 1952, subject to the approval or changes made by the County Court Judge. CARRIED.

\$55.00 fire fighting Acct.

That we apply to have Miss Elizabeth Wiebe placed in the Portage Home and we pay the \$25.00 account for her relief for July, 1952. CARRIED.  
Stevenson - Saurette;  
That we pay the Town of Morris the sum of \$55.00 re. fire fighting. CARRIED.  
Bunkowsky - Saurette;

Fillmore, Watson & Riley to handle cases.

That we place the case of Mrs. Richard & Family and the case of the Berthelette Twins in the hands of Fillmore, Riley & Watson re. legal procedure to place the responsibility of thier care and keep on the parants. CARRIED.  
Neufeld - Saurette;

Gravel Contract re. Lowe Farm - Rosenfeld road.

That Johnny Dueck be given the contract to gravel the Lowe-Farm - Rosenfeld road with 350 yards of gravel per mile. Price to be \$2.95 per yard supplied and delivered. CARRIED.

Bills & Accts.

Bills and accounts were handed to the Finance Committee, who reported that the Treasurer should be authorized to pay same as per list. CARRIED.  
Neufeld - Ribordy;

Delegations.

That the accounts amounting to the sum of \$38,886.67, approved by the Finance Committee be passed, and the Reeve and Secretary-Treasurer be hereby authorized to issue cheques for the several amounts. CARRIED.

Mr. Russell attended at the meeting re. drainage of our building property also asked if the Municipality would not widen the Meridian Line Road. He was advised that we would take care of the draining of our machine shed property this fall.

Mr. J.D. Riemer attended at the meeting re. Taxes on his lots and other property at Lowe Farm, he was advised that he should have appealed to the Court of Revision last fall, but that the Council would do what appeared to be right by way of any necessary adjustment.

Mrs. Thiessen attended at the meeting and asked she be allowed to purchase clothing Etc., for his children and charge same to the Municipality. She was advised that she should get permission from Councillor Recksiedler before making any purchases she wished the Municipality to pay for.

Mr. Palud of Aubigny attended at the meeting and asked that a culvert be placed at the road by his property East of Aubigny. He was advised that same would be done when the road was raised.

Mr. Buchard of Aubigny attended at the meeting re. the necessity of having a street light placed on the pole along the road just East of the Village. He was advised that same was to be placed there.

Mr. C. Giesbrecht of Lowe Farm, attended at the meeting re. weeds cutting on road allowances, and advised that in several instances road sides were very rough. He was advised to use his own judgement as weeds inspector re. compulsory cutting of road sides! weeds.

Mr. John I. Dyck attended at the meeting re. the business tax on the oil shed formerly used by him. As this matter would have to be attended to at the Court of revision re. the assessment roll, he would have to appeal at that time, and advised the Council he would do so.

The meeting adjourned about 6.00 O'Clock P.M., next meeting to be held in the Court House in the Town of Morris on Friday, September 12th, commencing at 10.00 O'Clock in the forenoon.
