

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS

Joint Meeting with E.M.O., Water Resources, and the Town of Morris, was held at 1 P.M. on Wednesday, April 12th., 1978, in the Council Chambers at the Town of Morris.

Water Resources:- The Town of Morris should have no problem because of the first class dykes. It would be the Water Resources decision when to close same, and they would foot the cost of the machinery, etc. The ring dykes have very little influence on the flooding of the rest of the land. It is thought that the water levels will between those of the years of 1966, and 1974.

E.M.O.:- The Council is responsible for all actions taken at this point. The money tree is gone!-There will be no aid from the Government until the flood is beyond the capabilities of the Municipality. It is up to each person to look after his own. Sand bags can be obtained from E.M.O. for 27¢ a bag, and can be returned, providing they are in 500 package lots. Barges can be obtained from the Agricultural Department. Troops can be obtained from the Federal Government at 100% cost.

The meeting adjourned.

Marcel A. Caron gave a report regarding the gravel in the gravel pits of Stanley Dueck, Gagne Gravel Co. Ltd., and H. W. Construction Co.

Moved by M. A. Caron, Seconded by Dan Thiessen: #67/78. Resolved that we buy 15,000 yards of gravel from Gagne Gravel Co. Ltd., and the balance of our needs (Approximately 3,000 Yds.) from Stan Dueck; both at \$2.25 per yard; That the said Gravel be hauled by B. K. F. Trucking at 13.25¢ per yard mile; And Further, if this is not acceptable to Stan Dueck, the total amount of Gravel to be purchased from Gagne Gravel Co. Ltd. Carried.
