EVACUATION INFORMATION

2 May 2022

EVACUATION CRITERIA

With the overland flooding and rising river levels, a mandatory evacuation order may be issued, and you may have to evacuate. You may voluntarily evacuate anytime but there may not be any compensation at anytime for non-mandatory evacuations.

If an evacuation becomes mandatory, both you and the RM of Morris are responsible for the first 72 hours. You can stay with friends and family that are outside the evacuation zone. If required, the RM can put you up at a community centre in a congregate shelter. If you wish to stay at a hotel, this would be your own choice and at your own expense although you may wish to check your personal home insurance and see if a hotel would be covered. Regardless, we recommend you keep all receipts.

Should a Disaster Finance Assistance Program (DFA) from the province come into effect it must be a mandatory evacuation to qualify for any assistance. That would only be for after the first 72 hours. Only hotels on the province pre-approved listing would be acceptable.

Should you have to be evacuated the Emergency Social Services (ESS) Registration Form will be required. This is being handed out here so you can have it partially filled out less evacuation date and have preregistration. Then when you leave you evacuate you will have to call the office so we can date and add the time you call to the form.

DISASTER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE *Facts*

Answering your questions about the DFA program

If you are a resident of Manitoba and you have damage to your home or business from a disaster, there are some important points to keep in mind.



TAKE PICTURES

Inspections may take time to happen, so take pictures of the damages to your property and any repairs made.



KEEP RECORDS

Keep invoices, receipts and any records of repairs made.



INSURANCE

Contact your insurance provider first. DFA does not pay for items that can be insured and does not top up insurance. Get a statement in writing.



TAX INFORMATION

Have your most recent property tax bill available. For businesses, have your complete income tax return from last year.

Disaster Financial Assistance (DFA) may be initiated following a significant event in which damage is widespread, mostly uninsurable and represents a significant financial burden to those impacted.

You can complete an application for Disaster Financial Assistance (DFA), even if a program has not been established. You can apply online, download a PDF application form or phone to have an application mailed to you. You can also get an application from your municipal office.

Your application does not guarantee that you will receive assistance or that a DFA program will be established. Submitting your application will help Manitoba EMO understand how big the disaster is.
